English

Reading and Writing

In shared reading and English lessons over the course of the first half of the autumn term, we will be reading and exploring *Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone* by J.K. Rowling. The children will be:

- Developing fluency and comprehension skills
- Learning to summarise passages of the text
- Making accurate predictions based on what they have read
- Comparing the text to others that they have read
- And increasing their vocabulary

The story will also be the stimulus for the children's writing until the October half term. They will be writing across a range of genres including: character and setting descriptions, narratives, letters, diaries and explanation texts.

In the second half of the autumn term, we will be reading and analysing biographical texts and using what we have learnt to create our own biographies of inspirational women.

We will finish the half term studying one of Shakespeare's plays. The children will have an opportunity to watch this performed and be inspired to create a range of texts from this.
